

Exploring the Secret of Success

“Success is trading the secret of anything others may not know.” The Chaplain, Covenant University, Pastor Charles Ihekwa, said this in a sermon, “Exploring the Secret of Success,” at the Chapel Service of Tuesday, March 8, 2016.

Pastor Ihekwa emphasised that the secrets of outstanding success is only accessible in the Bible, Deuteronomy 29: 29, and Joshua 1: 8, noting that Bible carries all the secrets of life. “The Bible is the book of life, Acts 5: 20,” he said.

He said that when a believer diligently abides by the secrets of the Bible, outstanding success shall be his portion, Deuteronomy 28: 1-2. “That is why breakthrough in life is not a promise but a covenant, Luke 5: 1-8.”

The Chaplain noted that until a believer played his part, God is not committed to playing His own part, Psalm 89: 34. “When the covenant is broken, breakthrough becomes impossible, Ecclesiastes 10: 5. Every issue of failure is a result of broken covenant, Mathew 5: 13-14. We have to take responsibility for our lives to shine. Biblical principles of success are forever valid and will work for anyone that puts them to work,” he explained.

Pastor Ihekwa also noted that certain forces are responsible for the success of the saints which include the power of love. Love, he said, is a failure proof virtue. He noted that if a believer operates in love, he would never see failure. “Love is the fulfillment of all Laws, Romans 13: 8-9”, he said, adding that, “When the law is fulfilled, one is set upon the nations of the earth, Deuteronomy 28: 1.”

The Chaplain enumerated some ways in which love empowers a believer for success. He said, “Love make believers more than a conqueror, 1John 4: 16-18; it establishes contact with God, Amos 3: 3; we enjoy supernatural favour with God and man, Genesis 39: 5 and every impossible gates are lifted, Isaiah 45: 1-2.”

He enjoined the congregation to exhibit God’s kind of love in order to be successful.
