We serve a prayer answering God and the altar of prayer, is the altar of man's answer to questions (Matthew 21:22; Mark 11:24; Psalm 65:2). All that God has can be received via the altar of prayer. Throughout history, God has always stepped in on behalf of His own, (Exodus 2:22-25; Psalm 26:6).

Divine intervention is the sudden movement of God upon a man's situation, (2 Chronicles 20:20-24). When miracles come your way at the point you already gave up, that is divine intervention.

When Do You Need Divine Intervention?

- When you are hedged in
- When there is no human solution to a problem (Luke 5:1-8; 2 Kings 4:18-32; John 11:40-44)
- When people ask you, "Where is your God?"
- When your life is following an evil pattern

Keys to Divine Intervention

- Come with expectations (Acts 3:5; Proverbs 23:18; Psalm 62:5)
- Come with worship (John 4:23)
- Come in the Name of Jesus, the access code to answered prayers (John 16:23-24)
- Believe in what the Name of Jesus carries. In that Name is domiciled all the glories of heaven (Proverbs 18:10)
- Come trusting ; trusting connotes having no alternatives (Psalm 125:1-3)
- Come crying for mercy (Proverbs 26:2)
