

Revelation: A demand for Responsibility

Revelation is having an understanding of what is expected of you. Therefore, it is a vital and indispensable tool in the hand of a person if destiny must be fulfilled (1 Chronicles 12:32).

Responsibility is what propels individuals to live life in agreement with what is expected of them, because of their understanding of the demand placed on them to function on their assignment – Heb. 6:9.

It takes revelation to know the will of God, and responsibility places a demand on all to do God's will (Colossians 1:9-10; Romans 12:2; Luke 12: 47-48).

Revelation simply entails the painting of pictures from scriptures (Isaiah 2:1). It is your ability, through the Holy Ghost, to be translated from being informed to being transformed (Ephesians 1:17-18).

Another important thing to consider is that revelation is dispensational in the sense that it delivers insight that is relevant for addressing issues of the moment (Ephesians 3:2-4).

What Are The Requirements of Revelation?

- ❖ To access revelation, a person must maintain self-discipline and maturity of the spirit (Galatians 4:1; Hebrew 5:13-14).
- ❖ We must maintain a high sense of commitment – 1 Tim. 4:13-14.
- ❖ You must have a continuous fellowship with the Holy Spirit (John 6:63; 2 Corinthians 3:5-6). It is the Holy Spirit who converts presumption to revelations. It is the preserved responsibility of the Holy Spirit to unveil divine agenda to those who fellowship with Him (John 16:12-14).
