**Message: Wisdom from Above Makes High Fliers – Genesis 41: 38 - 44**

Wisdom is a vital requirement for riding on the waves of glory. Proverbs 3 vs. 35; 1 Corinthians 2 vs. 7. When the wisdom from above is at work in the life of a man, it makes God's glory manifest naturally in such life (Psalm 119 vs. 97 – 100; Psalm 19 vs. 7 – 9), God's word is His wisdom bank. The Bible is God's wisdom in print.

The word of God is the wisdom of God. The wisdom from the word is superior to every wisdom (John 1 vs. 1 – 3; 1 Corinthians 1 vs. 24; 1 Corinthians 1 vs. 25; 2 Corinthians 13 vs. 8, Isaiah 55 vs. 9 - 11).

There are four kinds of wisdom (James 3 vs. 15 – 17; 1 Corinthians 2 vs. 6 - 7). There is the earthly or natural wisdom; there is the sensual or intellectual wisdom; there is the devilish or diabolical wisdom; and there is the divine or heavenly order of wisdom.

### **What is Wisdom?**

It is the profitable and productive application of knowledge. It is knowing what to do when to do it and how to go about doing it. It is what leads to outstanding accomplishment that culminates in exploits. Divine wisdom is the birth right of the redeemed.

### **How to Access the Treasures of Wisdom?**

1. Through the prayer altar. It is on the prayer altar that the secret treasures in God's word are released (Psalm 119 vs. 18; Jer. 33 vs. 3; James 1 vs. 5).
2. Putting God's word to work is wisdom (Deut. 4 vs. 5 – 6; Deut. 6 vs. 3). The word of God will always work if it is put to work. God's word lives and abides forever, and putting the Word of God is wisdom that is failure proof and results in generational impact (Matthew 7 vs. 24 – 25).
3. By being committed. When you are committed to putting God's word to work you naturally flow in wisdom (Joshua 1 vs. 8).
4. Meditation in the word of God. Sitting down on scripture, reading and thinking to access the juice of the word. (Job 1 vs. 1 - 3; Job 29 vs. 3 -6; 12 – 17; Luke 5 vs. 1 – 7; John 21 vs. 5 - 6).

Wisdom is the heritage of the redeemed; it is the birthright of the saved, and it is imperative to always ask oneself what are you doing with the words of God that has come your way.
