Theme: **Understanding the Master Key to a World of Exploits**

It takes a discovery to recover what has been lost. To the redeemed, exploit is their redemptive right (Matthew 11 vs. 11). Every child of God carries very great potentials more than all the greats of biblical times (Matthew 12 vs. 42; John 17 vs. 18).

The same way God gave Jesus as an exploit to the world so are the redeemed given to the world as exploits (Matthew 5 vs. 13 - 14; Genesis 1 vs. 3; Genesis 12 vs. 1 - 3; Genesis 22 vs. 17 - 18; Galatians 3 vs. 29; Genesis 13 vs. 14 - 15).

However, exploit will always be at the mercy of what your perception is concerning the future. What you see matters a great deal in your connection with the Abrahamic order of blessings that engenders exploits (Ephesians 1 vs. 17 - 18).

WHAT ARE THE PATHWAYS TO THE WORLD OF EXPLOITS?

1. You must be born again and be filled with the Holy Spirit (John 3 vs. 3; John 16 vs. 12 - 14).
2. You must walk in the fear of God (Psalm 25 vs. 14; 1 Thessalonians 2 vs. 10; 2 Corinthians 12 vs. 7).
3. You must possess the love of God in your heart. With the love of God in your heart, you cannot lack insight (1 Samuel 13 vs. 14; Acts 2 vs. 30; 2 Samuel 14 vs. 20). It is the love of God that makes something out of a nobody (Psalm 119 vs. 97 - 100).

BENEFITS FROM ENCOUNTER WITH GOD'S WORD

- ❖ You enjoyed sanctification, which empowers you to live to please God here on earth (2 Peter 1 vs. 1; Psalm 119 vs. 9 - 11).
- ❖ You are endued with divine strength. The believer enjoys divine strength both in the spirit and physical (Proverbs 24 vs. 5).

HOW DO WE ENGAGE THE WORD FOR EXPLOITS?

1. Continue to give thanks for the word discovered (Hebrews 10 vs. 35 - 36; 1 Thessalonians 5 vs. 18).
2. Refuse to quit (Galatians 6 vs. 9; Hebrews 10 vs. 38; Matthew 24 vs. 13).
3. Give yourself wholly to your findings with all your heart (1 Timothy 4 vs. 15).

Put those findings to work because the word of God will always work if you so choose to put it to work in faith.
