REGISTRY

1. Students are encouraged to check the portal for their 2016/2017 Omega Semester results after Senate approval by mid-June, 2017 and school fees for the new academic session.
 2. Returning students are to be on the lookout for the 2017/2018 resumption portal where detailed information on resumption protocols shall be duly communicated.
 3. Students' complaints/requests would be considered through an application after the release of 2016/2017 Omega Semester results and such complaints/requests shall include:
 - Result validations (online)
 - Remark of examination script
 - Change of course/programme
 - Deferment of studentship
 - Withdrawal of studentship
 - Change of Name
 - Make-up examination

4. School fees should be paid up on or before resumption into 2017/2018 Academic Session.
 5. Course registration for the 2017/2018 Academic

Session would be on Semester basis which should be done by all students before resumption.

6. Fully registered students (i.e. completed course registration and full payment of school fees) would be able to print out resumption clearance showing the following:
 - Student profile
 - Courses registered
 - Amount paid
 - Room allocated
7. All returning students will be allowed into the school only on presentation of the resumption clearance.
8. The University hereby reiterates that every student must obtain minimum 75% of lecture attendance in each course to be eligible to write the end of semester examinations.
9. Any student who does not resume academic activities three (3) weeks into resumption of Alpha Semester 2017/2018 would be deemed to have voluntarily withdrawn from the University.

Accreditation Visit: COREN Scores Covenant University High

The Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN) team on accreditation visit to the Engineering Programmes of Covenant University has expressed satisfaction with the quality and capacity of equipment, manpower and facilities available for the various engineering programmes that were up for reaccreditation.

The programmes were Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Petroleum Engineering, Computer Engineering, and Electrical and Electronics Engineering.

Presenting a summary of its report to the CU Management on Wednesday, April 5, 2017, Leader of the COREN accreditation team, Engr. Bukola Musiliu Adisa, said that he and members of his team had for three days gone round the University and inspected all facilities related to the programmes.

He noted that after reviewing the recommendations in the report of the last accreditation visit to the concerned engineering programmes, the COREN team observed that Covenant University has lived up to its responsibilities but can always aim higher.

A full report on the accreditation visit, he said, would be submitted to the COREN Council for deliberation, after which a report would be issued.

CU Student Wins 2017 SUSI Fellowship, Heads to US for Five Weeks

A 300 Level student of Information and Communication Engineering and President of the Covenant University Literary and Debating Society (CULDS), Dominic Onyeka Dominic, has been selected for the prestigious 2017 Study of United States Institute (SUSI) Fellowship for Student Leaders.

This makes Covenant University the first private university ever to produce a SUSI (Student Leaders) Fellow. By this feat, Dominic will be proceeding, fully funded by the US
